- Provide state-of-the-art services; such as advanced diagnostic imaging, telemedicine, sophisticated cancer detection and diagnosis, cardiovascular testing and more.
- Meet the needs of rural residents through the Richard G. Lugar Center for Rural Health, the Clay City Center for Family Medicine, the Rural Health Innovation Collaborative (RHIC) and Union Hospital Clinton.
- Educate health professionals, strengthen community partnerships, foster economic development and advocate for community health improvements.
- Provide care and public health education to those in need; including the diabetes and prediabetes support groups, as well as childbirth and breastfeeding classes.
- Become the only Level III Obstetric and Neonatal provider within an approximate 80-mile radius.
